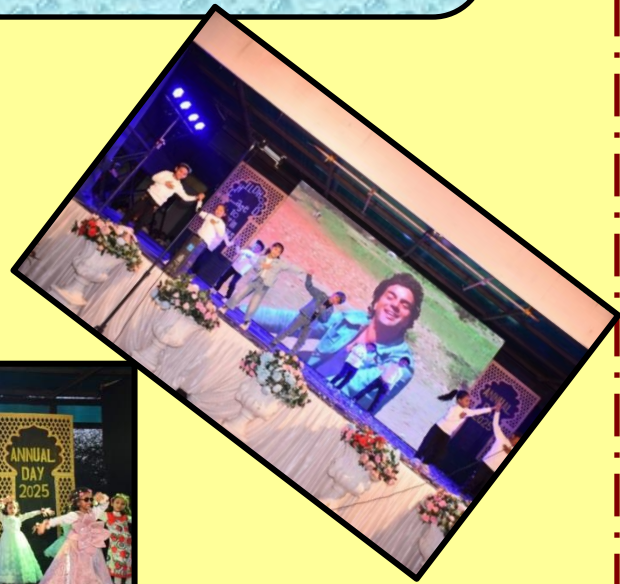


ANNUAL FUNCTION
